Members of the YMCA come together over the years to revisit and affirm the values that connect us through the Paris Basis; Kampala Principles; British Council and more recently the Challenge 21 documents.

Not every member of staff is required to be a Christian though this does apply to the most senior management post and officers of the Board, with every staff member and volunteer accepting a management / leadership role in the Association accepting the affirmation below. Our YMCA welcomes people of all faiths and of none to volunteer or seek employment in our YMCA.
